Citizens Advice's response to Ofgem's consultation on their Prosecution Policy Statement

This submission was prepared by the Consumer Futures team within Citizens Advice. It has statutory responsibilities to represent the interests of energy consumers in Great Britain. We welcome the opportunity to provide a submission on the Prosecution Policy Statement that sets out Ofgem's approach to all criminal prosecutions. Our response is not confidential and can be published on your website.

Q1: Do you agree with our proposed approach to the decision to prosecute criminal offences?

Yes. Citizens Advice agrees that Ofgem's proposed Policy Statement makes the approach to decision-making on criminal prosecutions fair, independent, objective and transparent. It is essential that the regulator's processes are transparent for all prosecutions. We agree with the proposal that the decision to prosecute is made only once the Full Code Test has been applied. We are encouraged by the clear and co-ordinated approach Ofgem is taking to this work.

Q2: Do you agree that the additional factors set out for consideration in relation to REMIT market abuse offences are relevant and appropriate?

Citizens Advice welcomes the additional factors set out for consideration in relation to REMIT market abuse offences, and agree that should ensure an appropriate, transparent and suitable approach.
